Special Educational Needs

As you will know from previous Newsletters, Mrs Barbara Hunter our School Improvement Partner has been covering the Senco role since Mrs Graham left. Unfortunately Mrs Hunter has been unwell this term so has not been able to do either of these roles in the way she wanted to. The good news is that she is now back with us to do the SIP role, and we have <u>also</u> managed to secure the services of a very experienced Senco, Mr Tim Roberts who will be staying with us until we are able to recruit a permanent Senco. Mr Roberts will be undertaking some different types of assessments with those children on the SEN (Special Educational Needs) register (if you don't know what this is then you probably don't need to know!)

We are delighted that we have the experience of both Mrs Hunter and Mr Roberts who will be with us on a part-time basis each week, on different days to support us all at Ashford Hill. If you have any questions for any of us, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Parents' Evening This Week

Parkers Donation – Read Write Inc

We have received a donation from Parkers estate agent of £545 towards our Read Write Inc scheme. Thank you to the PTA for arranging this way back last year. This will go towards boosting some of the resources that we use for phonics lessons.

Return of books

Reading at home is an important part of learning to read and we encourage families to read together. Every week children are sent home with books, and it is important that these are returned to the class teacher at the end of each week. Each Read Write Inc book costs around £6 per book and we only have a certain number in school; these books are also used for teaching. Please can you ensure that any library/read write inc. books that you have are returned to school as we would like to audit our stock. At this point, I will share the horror in my house this week as my 16 year old daughter and I discovered a school library book taken out in 2020 – it was returned with a huge apology to the librarian (apparently)! So, I can assure you that there will be no judgement if there is one book or 20 books returned over the next week.
