## **Residential Trips Moving Forward**

We have just returned home from a successful residential trip with Hornbeam class and it was amazing to see them grow so much in such a short space of time. It is at this time of year that we have to secure future bookings with activity centres and coach companies.

Residential trips have the following benefits for children:

- Develop independence in children
- Improve confidence and self esteem
- Improve relationships for children and teachers
- Engage and motivate children outside of the children with new activities
- Allow children to flourish and challenge themselves in a new environment
- Make lifelong memories

However, with rising costs and during a cost-of-living crisis I believe that to have a trip two years in a row will be very costly for families and I would like to stagger this cost for families in a more effective way (A week long residential can be around £400-£500per child increasing to nearly £600 for next year). Previously, I have experienced some fabulous year 4 residentials which have benefitted the self-esteem and independence of year 4 children before they move onto the upper primary school. A shorter time away really helps them to prepare for a longer residential in the future as well as the benefits listed above.

I would like to move towards a model of 2 residential trips throughout our children's primary schooling to enable children to experience the benefits of a residential trip sooner that year 5. This would look like the following:

- Year 4: 3 day (2 night) residential
- Year 6: 5 day (4 night) residential (post SATS)

I am aware that this then will affect our current year 4 cohort and I am conscious that they do not miss out on a residential of some description next year. I have been to consultation with the current year 4 parents about a trip for next year. For the final time year 5 will be joining year 6 for their residential after SATS in May 2024. Information and costs will follow next half term in order to stagger costs.

Next year's year 4 will take part in a 3 day residential trip in the 2023-2024 academic year – details will also be shared with you later this term.

In the academic year 2024-2025 we will move to the new model for residential trips.
