Back in September, Thomas (Oak) and Rowan Tordoff's (Willow) 8 year old sister Juliette very sadly died at home in the arms of her Mum and Dad. Juliette was born in 2015 with severe brain damage and was given a poor prognosis, but managed to live and enjoy life beyond what was expected. She is very sorely missed by all who had the pleasure of knowing her. The family were supported throughout her life and now after her death by Sebastians Action Trust and this is a charity truly close to their heart.

Sebastians Action Trust receive no government funding and rely fully on donations and fundraising efforts. We look forward to seeing the children in their jumpers on this day.

LIBRARY: Accelerated Reader - Help needed!

We are in the process of implementing a new reading initiative. This includes the restocking and reordering of the library. Accelerated reader is a programme that supports children to choose the appropriate books for their reading level and will support them to progress in their reading. It begins with an assessment of their current level of reading and then directs them to a section in the library to take their books from. This is then monitored by teachers and the children are able to complete star reader quizzes to ensure that they are reading and comprehending the book well.

In order to start this after Christmas, our whole library will need reordering. We have two whole weeks of term left and will need all of the parent/ grandparent help that we can get to complete this huge task.
