### What will be different?:

There will no longer be homework logs for the children to complete. All of this will be logged virtually on the systems that we use in school, so that we can track both engagement and progress. Teachers will be able to see engagement at the click of a button and they will check in with the children each week.

## **Purpose of Homework**

We believe that carefully selected homework is an important aspect of education and serves a variety of purposes for our children including:

- To provide opportunities for families, children and the school to work in partnership to achieve the aims and vision of the school
- To consolidate and reinforce children's skills, knowledge and understanding particularly in English and mathematics

• To empower children, as they get older, to develop the confidence and self-discipline needed to study as they progress though their educational career and beyond.

### **Homework Structure**

There are two types of homework for our children:

## Weekly homework:

Reading, Spelling Log Review and Maths

## Termly Project homework:

Each learning journey involves a termly curriculum showcase. The homework will be displayed as part of the topic showcase. This is not compulsory homework but will support children in gaining further knowledge and a deeper understanding of their current learning journey at home. Teachers will send home a letter at the start of a term to inform you of the project homework for this period.

	From the Spring Term, year 6 children will be provided with SATs booster books. There will be an additional maths and grammar/reading task set each week which will total and additional 30 minutes of work each week. This will be set each	

NB. Children will have access the Purple Mash programme. Purple Mash is an award-winning website for children aged 5 to 11, packed with creative tools, educational games and themed resources. Children can independently enjoy this at home. Passwords will be provided with an accompanying letter from the class teacher early next week.

#### **Reading homework**

All children will bring home books so they can read with you and to you daily. Our suggested reading homework is 10 minutes per day. The books the children bring home will depend on the year group they are in.

- YR and Y1 children will continue to bring home their RWI phonics book (or Ditty's for some children in YR) which they are reading in class, plus a RWI book bag book. They will also be able to bring home a library book, should they wish to.
- Y2 children will continue to bring home a RWI phonics book plus a RWI book bag until February half term. They will also be able to bring home a library book, should they wish to. After February half term, those children who have completed RWI phonics will bring home an Accelerated Reader levelled book plus a library book, should they wish. The children will take a reading assessment which will tell us the level of book they should be reading. Any child still on phonics will continue to bring home their RWI phonics book, a RWI book bag book plus a library book, should they wish to.
- Y3 6 children will continue to bring home a library book until the week beginning 22 January when they will bring home an Accelerate Reader levelled book plus a library book, should they wish to. The children have already taken a reading test which tells us the level of book they should be reading.

Miss Hudson will be launching Accelerated Reader with the children next week so please look out for the parent information which will follow.

## **Spelling Homework (Year 2-6)**

We will no longer be doing weekly spelling tests or sending set spelling lists home to learn. Research shows that learning spellings this way does not aid progress or application of skills. At Ashford Hill, we believe in doing the work that makes the difference to both our progress and to our life balance.

Read, Write, Inc. Spelling is a spelling programme based on proven strategies of teacher modelling, followed by partner work to embed learning. The programme covers all of the word structures and spelling requirements for Years 2-6 and is the next step in your child's learning from the Read, Write, Inc. Phonics programme that we already follow in EYFS and Year 1. The scheme has been specially created to meet the higher demands of the spelling curriculum appendix and the results it produces are outstanding. We certainly hope that it has the same impact with our pupils.

Your child will now receive:

- Spelling pattern lessons three times per week.
- In-school access to the Read, Write, Inc. Spelling practice books which are full of structured activities and lively illustrations.
- Their own Logbooks, which are to be taken home to record individual progress and build a home/school link. This can be done through practising words that your child has written to 'Log and Learn'.

Consolidation of their weekly spellings will be through a range of other teamwork activities within the spelling lesson. Pupils' spelling knowledge will continue to be assessed informally on a weekly basis and then through a spelling test at the end of each half-term. This will ensure that they have consolidated the spelling rules learned in the half-term. Therefore, it is important that, as part of their homework, pupils use their 'Logbooks' to continually review and revise spelling rules and patterns that have been previously taught, using their words to 'Log and Learn' each week. There will be a new spelling pattern taught every two weeks and the words inside the children's logs will be refreshed.

You could call out the words for your child to spell aloud or quickly jot down and write your initial next to the word each time they spell it correctly. Keep returning to words on previous pages until you are sure your child can spell them easily. Regular repetition of spellings is important to ensure that all pupils can consolidate and apply their spelling knowledge.

The school has made a considerable investment buying in this scheme and the spelling scheme will have the most impact if pupils take home their Logbooks for daily practice of their 'Log and Learn' words. However, should a logbook be lost, there would be a charge of £2.00 needed to replace it. Books should be in school every day and kept in their school bags.

We are really looking forward to seeing the results from this scheme.

Year 1 children will be completing their spelling reviews during class time with Mr Walker and will not be bringing them home.

#### **Maths Homework**

Year 1 and 2 - Numbots passwords should have been sent home already for children to use. This programme is fantastic at supporting children with number bonds and early calculation. We recommend that it is practised in short intervals of 5 minutes. The more that children complete, the more they learn and they will also earn coins to make their own robots.

Year 3-6 - Times tables are the absolute key to the success of our children in maths. Without the rapid recall of these number facts, children will find the end of key stage assessments very difficult and the next stages of education will be a challenge. Timestable Rockstars should be used at regular intervals throughout the week for children to practice these. It is also great if you can work on these with your children. It really does make all the difference. Class teachers have already sent home the passwords.

If you do have any further questions regarding homework passwords or information, please do speak with your class teacher.

#### **Feedback**

Homework Feedback is an important part of learning and progress and there are many different ways this can happen. We recognise that much of this feedback will be provided by adults working with the children as they do their homework and not solely by the teacher. Use of systems such as Accelerated Reader, NumBots and Timestables Rock stars are personalised to children and the teacher will have an overview of children's strengths and weaknesses from the accompanying teacher software. This enables homework to guide formative assessment and future learning in school.
