Dear Parents/Carers,

We have had a fantastic week here at Ashford Hill. On Wednesday, we invited in the Trustees of Thames Learning Trust to visit the school. This was part of their monitoring of our school development plan and also to see the school in action. I was so proud to show them around every classroom and they thoroughly enjoyed speaking to all of the children and the staff. I am waiting for the final report of their visit which I will share with you as soon as I can but the initial feedback is as follows:

- Wonderful children who are articulate and love school and love their learning
- Children are extremely proud of the work that they produce and they feel safe in school.
- The learning behaviours in the inclusive classrooms were impressive to see.
- The staff team have high expectations of the children and there is consistency in the way that they articulate this.
- The environment is warm, inviting and inclusive.

Children really appreciate the work that the teachers and whole staff team do for them.

As you can imagine, we are delighted with how the day went and were extremely proud to have been able to share the developments that we have made over the last few terms with regard to our curriculum design and work around the pedagogy of teaching. Most importantly, our children's love for learning shone through.

Wednesday brought World Book Day. It really is one of my favourite mornings of the year – the staff arrive early and

admire each other's creations and surprises as we enter the building. This year there were smiles all round as we had our very own Mr and Mrs Twit in the form of Mr Walker and Mr Dixon: what a treat! This is shortly followed by the arrival of our children who astound us with their costume creativity and love of books every year. Thank you to parents for helping the children with their



creations; as you can see from the photograph above, everyone looked fantastic.



All of our children took part in a special book day treasure hunt, finding out about characters, books and authors. They worked hard all day to find out clues from teachers (and each other) about who their characters were and which book they came from – they then had to research authors and book titles with much success!

Children will need to bring a small backpack with a named water bottle, two packed lunches and plenty of snacks. If your child needs medication, this will need to be left at reception and a form completed on the day.

If you are volunteering for this trip, please arrive at school at 10.30 for a full briefing and safeguarding talk prior to leaving.

We are really looking forward to this experience and I cannot wait for you to hear all about it when the children return home.

Children who are attending this event will need to have packed lunch on this day. They will be eating this prior to leaving school at 12pm. School Uniform and Presentation

We are more than half way through the school year and we are well settled into our school routines. In order to focus on our learning and strive towards being the 'best that we can be' it is important that we are dressed for learning. School uniform must be worn daily and school shoes on non-PE days. Trainers should only be worn on PE days and only school branded jumpers and hoodies are permitted. Hair that can be tied up, should be tied up as even shoulder length hair that is down can hugely detract from learning. If you require any uniform to update your wardrobe, please contact the PTA as they have a huge amount of pre-loved, good-quality uniform if you require a refreshed stock at home.

Children must not wear jewellery in school, with the exception of one stud earring in each ear. Nails must also be varnish free. If children have used home tattoos at the weekend, these must be removed before school (this is easily done with baby oil).

The PTA have kindly contributed towards a staff PE kit, this is to model to the children the expectations of their PE kits and to show that our uniform represents both our school and ourselves and our attitude to presentation and learning. We are looking forward to the arrival of these.
